

PB Washington Update - July 2, 2012 - Interim Update

Late on June 29, President Obama opted to sign a one-week extension of the existing surface transportation program through July 6 in order to give the White House time to plan some sort of signing ceremony for the new MAP-21 two-year authorization bill later this week. There is no indication that the President might veto the bill.
